The CELPIP Preparation evening class consists of four 9-hour modules, one module per week. Each lesson features materials which reinforce the format of the CELPIP Test. Students who complete these exercises, activities, and resources will be able to improve their performance on the CELPIP Test.

Candidates who are taking either test (General for Permanent Residency or LS for citizenship) are eligible to apply for the modules they wish to focus on and will receive a workbook for the skill module(s) selected:

- > Speaking
- > Listening
- > Reading
- > Writing

CELPIP Private one-on-one lessons are also available. Each module costs \$250 (all included + book).
